OBJECTIVES of WP5

- Implementation of tools designed to facilitate models of polycentric development for territories affected by major transport infrastructure (MTI)
- Capitalization of results and good practices achieved within transnational European projects
- Identification of technical solutions to support the decisionmaking process linked to major transport infrastructure

HOW IS IT ACHIEVED?


POLY5 foresees a toolkit: in computing a toolkit is a set of widgets for use in designing applications with graphical user interfaces (GUIs).

A widget (or control) is an element that displays an information arrangement changeable by the user. The defining characteristic of a widget is to provide a single interaction point for the direct manipulation of a given kind of data.

In POLY5 the idea of the TOOLKIT is similar: given a set of data, we plan to provide the user (in our case the target groups addressed by the project) with the possibility to manipulate specific elements in order to generate solutions tailored on each territory having to deal with the presence of a Major Transport Infrastructure.

The toolkit developed in this Work Package 5 will provide the basis for project partners pilot actions foreseen in Work Package 6 and each project partner involved will choose the most suitable tool to implement them

The toolkit will be presented in Ljubljana during the next POLY5 meeting (see box on the left).

REGIONE del VENETO 23/07/2013 – Round of Focus Groups on WP5 has begun



On 23rd July towards the Veneto Region's headquarter in Venice, it was organized the first Focus Group for the validation and implementation of the toolkit foreseen within WP5.

The meeting, first out of six prevented within the end of October, put together several experts on themes like environment, landscape and infrastructure management belonging to both public and private organizations and it was organized to collect constructive feedbacks on the decisional matrix used as baseline to realize the WP5 local toolkit.

Therefore the meeting was able to identify some critical point of the tool that have been underlined by some of the consulted experts and that became one of the starting point of discussion within the following work of implementation done by the team working on its realization.

Within the fall 2013 some other thematic focus group are planned to finalize and fine tune the tool that will be then tested concretely on a specific territory.

Baltic-Adriatic and Mediterranean Corridors: a necessary synergy

Within POLY5 project, co-funded by the European transnational cooperation Programme Alpine Space 2007-20013, involving 10 partners from Italy, France, Austria, Germany and Slovenia, Transpadana is conducting an analysis of the current transport supply and demand situation in the crucial area of junction between Mediterranean and Baltic-Adriatic corridors.

The analysis simulates possible evolution of transport demand and supply evaluating the effects of different alternatives of the infrastructure design proposals in terms of impact on the network.

The aim is to highlight the possible synergies between the two European corridors that affect our territories to draw the road map for the next interventions, examining the possible alternatives and share them with decision makers in terms of political, financial and transport perspectives. The goal is to under stand together, starting with a shared framework, what is possible to do, when and how.
